This week in Reception, the children have been exploring the outside area to observe the changes that come with the arrival of autumn. During our nature walks, we collected a variety of autumnal treasures including colourful leaves, conkers, acorns, pinecones, and twigs. The children were fascinated by the different shapes, textures, and colours they found, and we used this opportunity to discuss how the weather is changing — the air becoming cooler, the days shorter, and the leaves beginning to fall from the trees. All of our findings were brought back to the classroom and carefully arranged in our investigation area, where the children can continue to explore, sort, and talk about the signs of autumn throughout the week.





In Science, Year 2 have been exploring the topic Living Things and Their Habitats. The children have been learning how to tell the difference between living and non-living things, thinking about the features that all living things share. They have also been finding out what plants need to grow and stay healthy, such as water, light and the right temperature. The class has enjoyed making observations and asking questions about the world around them.







Year 1 have been learning about the parts of a plant and how they grow from seeds. We have explored how plants get their nutrients from the soil and what they need to grow.





This term in Science, Year 3 are becoming rock detectives! The children have been exploring different types of rocks, learning about their properties and how to identify them. Through hands-on investigations, they are testing and comparing rocks to see how strong they are, whether they let water through, and how they are used in everyday life. These lessons are helping them build a deeper understanding of the natural world around them.







Year 4 do not have a science topic this year!



Year 5 have been exploring gravity through exciting experiments, testing how different objects fall. Pupils predicted, observed, and compared results, discovering how shape and size affect speed. Real scientists in action!







In Year 6 this term we have been looking at classification, which is the grouping and identification of flora and fauna from close observation of physical characteristics. We have recapped the five main types of vertebrates (mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish) and have started thinking about invertebrates before we will move onto micro-organisms.

HOW WE KEEP CHILDREN SAFE

 Pupil Leadership: Our School Ambassadors gather pupil voice to share children's views and ideas, while Play Leaderssupport at break and lunchtimes to make sure play is safe, fun, and inclusive.



- Personal Development Curriculum: We teach children about healthy relationships, recognising trusted adults, managing emotions, and speaking up if they feel unsafe.
- Computing Curriculum: Children learn about online safety, including how to spot unsafe content, cyberbullying, privacy, and safe use of AI tools.



TIPS FOR KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE AT HOME

Our local safeguarding data shows that neglect, emotional abuse and physical chastisement are key concerns in our community. Here are some ways you can help keep children safe and supported at home:

Consistency & Care: Make sure children have regular meals, sleep routines, and a calm home environment.

Positive Discipline: Praise and rewards are more effective than physical punishment. Talk through problems and model calm behaviour.

Emotional Check-ins: Ask your child how they're feeling each day. Listen without judgement and reassure them it's okay to share.

Online Safety at Home:

- Set clear screen time boundaries.
- Keep gaming and devices in shared spaces.
- Talk to your child about who they interact with online.
- Use parental controls where appropriate.




