From Egg to Butterfly: A Journey of Growth and Wonder In our EYFS setting, the children have been nurturing real butterfly eggs, watching in awe as they transformed through each magical stage—from tiny caterpillars to beautiful butterflies. This hands-on experience has been a powerful link to Personal Development, encouraging curiosity, patience, empathy, and responsibility. Through caring for the butterflies, the children developed a sense of wonder about nature, learned to respect living things, and reflected on their own growth and feelings. Just like the butterflies, they are learning that change takes time, care, and courage.



Year 2

Children in Year 2 have been learning about different core values, they have learnt about curiosity and created their own curiosity box, they then asked questions they were curious about on post it notes and included it in their curiosity box.



Year 1

In Year 1 we have been learning to recognise and

understand emotions. The children explored different

feelings, such as happiness, sadness, anger, and

excitement, and discussed how our facial expressions

and body language can show how we feel. We talked

about why it's important to express emotions in healthy

ways and practised using words to explain how we are

feeling. Through stories and role-play, the children

also learned strategies to manage big emotions, like

taking deep breaths or asking for help.

This term year 3 explored friendship in Personal Development, identifying important qualities in friends such as kindness and honesty, helping them understand and build positive, supportive relationships with others.
