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This week Reception started their topic **Storytellers**. We came in dressed in our pyjamas and listened to lots of stories with our cuddly toys. We have learnt to tell the story of 'The Little Red Hen', painted red hens, baked the hen's bread and created our own classroom farm!










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Hornbeam's big bang lesson was to discover the history of HMS Windrush. The children waited patiently in a queue to board HMS Windrush, each child had their own ticket. 'The Captain' directed them to their dormitories, which were extremely cramped. The children were excited and nervous to board the boat. We then proceeded to have a discussion about the 22 day journey that people took from the Caribbean to England and how it must have felt. The children could not believe that it took 22 days!

This term in writing, Year 1 will be exploring the book Beegu. For our hook lesson the children experienced the aftermath of a spaceship crash in our classroom. They looked carefully to identify what could have caused it? What had happened? Where had it come from? And who it belonged to? We used all of this information to make predictions about our core text.









During our hook lesson, we became archaeologists exploring different types of Roman artefacts. We were focusing on identifying the different uses of each artefact. It was fascinating seeing what objects the Romans would have used for their everyday lives. We even attempted writing with our very own quill which we really enjoyed and were able to perfect our handwriting whilst using it.



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Here are some pictures from our Big Bang day. The children were archaeologists, digging up Egyptian artefacts to see what we could learn about this ancient civilisation.











In Year 4, history came to life as children embarked on a creative journey to explore the fascinating world of Vikings. As part of their hands-on history children lesson, the enthusiastically delved the Viking into Age, where fierce warriors roamed the seas with their iconic shields.

Year 6

Year 6 began the new year looking at the topic of migration through our core text, The Arrival by Shaun Tan. We discussed what it would be like to find ourselves in danger, who we would usually turn to, and what would be our 'safety net'. We then considered what it would be like if all our support systems were withdrawn and we suddenly found ourselves in the position of having to flee to another country if a dangerous situation, like a war, occurred.
