In Reception class, as part of our Religious Education (R.E.) learning, the children have been exploring the significance of Christmas. They engaged in a range of creative and reflective activities that helped bring the festive story to life. The children enjoyed making decorations and hanging them around the classroom, and we transformed our role-play area into Santa's workshop, allowing them to explore themes of giving and kindness in a hands-on way. To extend their learning beyond the classroom, the children also visited a local care home to sing Christmas songs, sharing joy and celebrating community. 










This term, Year 3 children are learning about different religions and how people pray and worship. They are exploring the unique practices of each faith and understanding the values and traditions that are important to people around the world.








