








In Year 2 we read our magical tale "Yokki and the Parno Gry". We ordered the story using pictures and added sentence openers and adjectives. We also created our own magical creatures and used adjectives to describe them!








During our hook lesson, children were acting as archaeologists who had been sent on a top-secret mission to help the research team at Jurassic Park to locate and identify different parts of a meteor which hit the land the school over a million years ago.







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As part of our hook lesson in Year 4, the children became Greek budding artists as they dived into the world of Greek mythology. They learned about different ancient Greek masks and created their very own, using different patterns and intricate details to bring their masks to life. The children were given different war hero scenarios and came up with fantastic short plays.









In year5, children played the role of detectives as part of the hook lesson for their main core text. They encountered several artefacts. They studied the clues to find out what crime was committed, where it was performed, why it was committed, and by whom. Some of the clues were suspect board, bloodied crown, daggers, Scottish map, chalice, and phantom skull. To find the suspect, they communicated with one another and made connections between the clues. Additionally, to display stage awareness through their body language and voice, children acted out a scene from the play Macbeth in front of the entire class and adults, choosing





Year 6 began the term with a visit to the National Maritime Museum on Monday to find more out about polar exploration. We discovered how explorers have survived in the hostile environment, what sort of animals live in both the Arctic and Antarctic as well as the indigenous people in the arctic circle.
