In Magnolia class, we created a dedicated area within the classroom to support meaningful discussion and exploration around differences, diversity, and inclusion. We transformed a corner into a themed 'treasure chest' space, filled with culturally relevant artifacts, books, dolls representing different ethnicities and abilities, clothing, and images reflecting a variety of backgrounds and experiences. Children were invited to explore the items and take part in circle time sessions where they could share their thoughts. This sparked insightful conversations; for example, one child said, "She wears that dress for a special celebration – like when we had Eid at my house," while another pointed to a doll in a wheelchair and said, "He's like my cousin - he plays football too!" The space encouraged children to recognise and celebrate differences, helping them build empathy and a sense of belonging within the classroom community.





Year 2 children have been learning about Judaism, exploring different religious objects and understanding the significance of the Star of David to Jewish people.








This half term Year 1 have been exploring Christianity and what Christians believe. We have looked at some key vocabulary such as 'Bible' and 'prayer' and we have read the story of Noah's Ark.






In RE, Year 3 have been studying the big question: "What do different people believe about God?" As part of this learning, pupils have explored the beliefs of Christians, Hindus and Muslims, considering the significance of God within each faith and reflecting on the similarities and differences between them.








In RE this term, we have been learning about what it's like to be a Hindu in Britain today. The children explored vibrant festivals such as Holi and Diwali, discovered how Hindus worship in temples, and learned about the many gods and goddesses they pray to. It's been a fascinating journey of culture and faith.






This term, Year 5 have been exploring the concept of God. They have discussed why some people believe in God and why others may not, developing their understanding of different faiths and worldviews. The children have also reflected on their own beliefs and expressed their ideas with thoughtfulness and respect during class discussions.
