This week we started our topic Explorers! Our class chest was stolen and brought back with objects inside. We figured out it was borrowed by an explorer and made binoculars to hunt for them. We didn't find them so we created wanted posters to ask the school for help!



Year 1, had an exciting hook lesson pretending to be pirates for our topic 'Shiver Me Timbers.' The children started our hook using our green screen room by imitating how pirates act such as hunting for gold, cleaning the decks and opening the treasure . The children then travelled around the school on the hunt for gold while acting like pirates and greeting members of staff with "Arr matey"!














In Year 2 we introduced our topic – Hakuna Matata. We learnt about Anansi folk tales from the past and the background knowledge behind these stories including:

- Where the stories come from African culture
- How the stories were told Story told orally long ago
- Who is the main character Anansi is a folk tale character
- What the stories are about Anansi is commonly depicted as a spider
- Story will involve wisdom, knowledge, and trickery
- Morals

We then shared a variety of folk tales based on Anansi around the campfire and discussed the morals behind each of the stories.



During our hook lesson, we were introduced to different symbols which we may find on a map. We identified different symbols which we would find in and around our school. With this knowledge and information, we created our own scaled down maps to help guide us around the school to find these locations. Upon entering our final destination, we thought we should share these maps with the rest of the school on the playground.











For our hook lesson Year 4 were equipped with only old cloths, branches, and string, they crafted shelters and worked as a team to overcome challenges, fostering the school core value of resilience. They gathered around the fire and delved into discussions on climate change and habitat adaptation, nurturing a deep connection to nature and invaluable life skills.



As part of our geography hook lesson, children in year 5 used some basic materials to make their own volcano models. They used food colouring and white vinegar and used cards to construct a volcano around the bottle. They filled the volcano with vinegar and put some baking soda inside and observed the volcano explode!



Year 6



Our Year 6 cohort united to unravel hidden messages and decode mysteries. As young codebreakers, they went out in the field into the forest trying to crack intricate ciphers and unveiling secret messages. Children discovered the power of teamwork, critical thinking and creativity. Children then worked in partners to crack the code and organise the secret messages together.
