This week we were delighted to host a special day showcasing how we use technology to support inclusion across our school, in partnership with LGfL and EdTech. Visitors toured lessons from Year 1 to Year 6 and saw technology in action: Magma Maths in Year 1, children in Year 3 using green screen to bring their writing to life, and Year 6 pupils creating GIFs to demonstrate reversible and irreversible changes in science. Our quests were particularly impressed by the children's confidence in using accessibility features on their iPads to support their learning.

A big shoutout to all the teachers and pupils at Willow Bank School! I am impressed with how well embedded inclusion is here and how you're doing so using the iPad!"

During Cuddle a Teddy Week, children learnt about care, kindness, and responsibility by looking after their own special teddy. Through our Teddy Bear Hospital role-play, they explored the idea of real-life superheroes, such as doctors, nurses, and paramedics, who help people when they are hurt or unwell. Children compare these real helpers with fictional superheroes they know from stories, talking about how both real and make-believe heroes try to keep others safe. By caring for their teddy bears, taking on hospital roles, and practising gentle, helpful behaviour, children develop empathy, confidence, and an understanding of how they themselves can be everyday superheroes in the classroom and beyond.









Year 1 have been talking about bullying and discussing safe adults they can talk to when they need to.





In PSHE this week, Year 2 explored teamwork through a fun and challenging activity: making paper chains using only strips of paper; no glue, no scissors!









This term in Personal Development lessons, Year 3 has been learning about respect and personal boundaries. They have been discussing how everyone has the right to feel safe, listened to, and comfortable. The children have been sharing ideas about giving others space, using kind words, and showing respect in the classroom and playground. They have also been exploring ways to help make our school a caring and respectful community.













This week in PD, Almond Class learned about mutual respect. We discussed how our words and actions show kindness, listened to each other's ideas, and practiced respectful choices in different situations. The children shared thoughtful examples and are working hard to use mutual respect in the classroom and beyond.





Year 5 have been learning about expressing identity and individuality, exploring the personal qualities that make each of us unique. Pupils reflected thoughtfully on what shapes who we are and practised sharing their identities with confidence, respect, and pride within our school community.
